INTRODUCTION

The International Registry of Interests in Aircraft Equipment ("the Registry") was established pursuant to the provisions of the Cape Town Convention and Aircraft Protocol.¹

The International Civil Aviation Organization ("ICAO") is the Supervisory Authority of the Registry² and Aviareto Limited is the Registrar of the Registry³.

Sections 10.1 of the Regulations for the Registry⁴ ("the Regulations") requires that the Registrar Registry shall maintain updated registration statistics and shall publish them in an annual report. This report shall be electronically accessible to any person".

Section 10.2 of the Regulations states "the registration statistics" shall consist of:

"(a) transactional volumes and revenues subdivided in each case by registration type and geographic distribution; and (b) other compilations of non-confidential information requested by the Supervisory Authority".

This fifteenth annual statistical report is being posted on the Registry website in fulfilment of the requirements of Section 10 of the Regulations.

Activity levels


The year 2020 was marked by the COVID-19 Global Pandemic. The aviation industry suffered a severe economic shock which left airlines with significantly reduced revenue streams for a protracted period. This in turn required airlines and other aircraft operators to raise cash to ensure their survival. Many airlines and other aircraft operators raised cash using their aircraft as collateral, as the protection offered by the Convention and Protocol may have encouraged creditors. The number of new individuals and corporate aircraft owners was reduced due to economic uncertainty.

The activity levels on the International Registry reflect the effects of the pandemic on the aviation industry. There was a significant drop of 10.5% in the registrations of sales and prospective sales from the previous year. This is as might be expected during the pandemic when aircraft are not a cash generating asset (other than by refinancing them). On the other hand, aircraft financings and re-financings, as indicated by registrations of international interests and prospective international interests, grew by 5.4%. Both indicators had been relatively flat since 2017, but the pandemic pushed one up and the other down as can be seen in Figure 1 below.

Overall, the total number of registrations effected in 2020 decreased by only 3.2% to 134,316 compared with 138,834 in 2019. These registrations were effected on marginally more (+2%) aircraft objects than the previous year.

The number of priority search certificates issued increased by 8.4% to 134,921 from 124,464 in 2019. This may have reflected aircraft owners checking their assets to see what was unencumbered and therefore available as collateral.

The number of registrations effected through CLOSING ROOM[®] in 2020 was 93,556, up 4% on the previous year. This represents 69% of all registrations made during the year.




The changes in activity levels against the previous year are noted in the table below.

Administrators and users

The total number of new administrators and users in 2020 fell by just 1.1% to 7,335, compared with 7,418 in 2019. The global pandemic appears to have accelerated the reduction in new administrators and users which was first noted in 2019. Licence renewals were also down from 6,716 in 2019 to 6,181 in 2020, a reduction of 7.9%.



The number of controlled entities created in 2020 decreased by 43.8% to 119 from 212 in 2019. The number of controlled entity renewals decreased in 2020 by 3.8% to 838 from 872 in 2019.

Manufacturer Serial Numbers

By the end of the year, 59 manufacturers were regularly supplying the Registry with updates of the manufacturer serial numbers (MSNs) of airframes, helicopters, and engines. As a result, approximately 403,245 MSNs are now stored on the Registry system. This information is electronically supplied to registering users. The use of such information, where supplied, is mandatory under Section 5.1 of the Regulations.

The cooperation of manufacturers in supplying this information to the Registry was arranged through the Aviation Working Group.

Registry availability⁸

The availability achieved in 2020 was 99.79% compared to 99.76% in 2019.

Improvements to the Registry system

To assist the aviation industry at the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, the International Registry waived the fee for replacing digital certificates from 23rd March to the end of June 2020. This assisted users who had to work from home and needed access to the Registry.

In June 2020, Aviareto commenced accepting Confirmation of Entitlement to Act forms with electronic signatures, improving the user experience during the application process and helping to increase efficiency and the speed of approvals for clients who were working from home because of the pandemic.

To enhance communication with the Registry Officials, 'Live Chat' functionality was added in April 2020. Live Chat enables a user to initiate a conversation directly with the Registry Officials by clicking on a link on the International Registry website to receive assistance.

Google Analytics⁹

Other technical improvements included the introduction of Google Analytics. This service went live in April 2020. Google Analytics enables better monitoring of user trends on the Registry.

Registry system security

In 2020, Aviareto's Cybersecurity auditor Deloitte Ireland LLP carried out a series of security reviews and penetration tests across its corporate IT environment and against the International Registry System, including but not limited to infrastructure and application penetration testing. Risks were identified, evaluated, and categorised. Risks were treated according to the Registrar's risk management framework. Management is satisfied that the issues found have been dealt with appropriately and cause no significant risk to the business.

Liability insurance

Errors and omissions insurance cover remained at \$200 million during 2020.

Complaints

Section 8 of the Regulations and Section 14 of the Procedures make provision for complaints to be made to the Registrar.

Section 8.1 of the Regulations provides for complaints concerning the operation of the International Registry. There were no such complaints in 2020.

The Eighth Edition of the Regulations and Procedures added a new provision under Section 8.3 of the Regulations to allow complaints from persons adversely affected by unilateral registrations. There were two such complaints made in 2020. Details of the complaints can be found in Table 8 below.

Liaison with the user community

The Registrar continued to maintain close contact with the user community and conducted its customary annual survey of customer opinion during the second half of the year. Feedback from the user community and the outcome of the survey are important in shaping the programme for the Registry's future development. The overall weighted Registry user experience achieved a composite score of 8.65 (out of 10) in 2020, a very marginal decrease from 8.66 in 2019.

Due to the COVID-19 restrictions in place during 2020, the Registrar was unable to attend seminars related to the Cape Town Convention or the International Registry. However, the International Registry organised thirteen online webinars, including one-to-one webinars, on various International Registry topics.

The International Registry Advisory Board (IRAB) held a face-to-face meeting in January 2020 in Oklahoma City, USA to discuss proposed changes to the Regulations and Procedures for the International Registry. Several further IRAB meetings were held by videoconference to finalise the submission to ICAO for the Tenth Meeting of the Commission of Experts of the Supervisory Authority of the International Registry (CESAIR) in 2021. The IRAB continues to provide advice to

the Registrar and to contribute substantially to the development of policy and practice. It also acts as a valuable channel for user and industry feedback.

Tax free status

The concession granted by the Irish Revenue Commissioners to the Registrar exempting corporation tax in respect of its operation of the Registry was renewed for 2020.

International Standards Organisation (ISO)

The Registrar achieved a successful recertification audit to Standard ISO 9001:2015¹⁰. This was with the National Standards Authority of Ireland. Successful surveillance audits were also carried out by the British Standards Institute on Standards ISO 27001:2013¹¹ and ISO 22301:2012¹².

Financial performance of the Registrar

The Statement of Financial Position of the Registrar for 2020 as filed with the Irish Companies Registration Office is included in this report.

The Registrar had a surplus of \$1,051,787 income over expenditure in 2020 (\$532,212 in 2019) enabling it to achieve a shareholders' surplus of \$10,257,636 (\$9,205,849 in 2019) comprising \$10,017,601 of retained earnings and \$240,035 of called-up share capital. In the course of the year, capital expenditure on the system of \$2,095,305 was incurred. At year end the Registrar had deferred revenue obligations to its users of \$1,352,249 (\$1,405,600 in 2019).

Cases brought under Article 44 of the Cape Town Convention

Under Article 44 (1) of the Cape Town Convention, "[t]he courts of the place in which the Registrar has its centre of administration shall have exclusive jurisdiction to award damages or make orders against the Registrar".

As the Registrar is located in Ireland, the Irish High Court has exclusive jurisdiction to award damages and make orders against the Registrar. The relevant Irish legislation is the *International Interests in Mobile Equipment (Cape Town Convention) Act 2005* with procedural matters set out in Order 81A of the *Rules of the Superior Courts*, S.I. No. 31 of 2008.

In 2020 one case was decided before the High Court in Ireland. The Registrar was a named Respondent in the proceedings as prescribed by the Rules of the Superior Courts.

This case proceeded under Article 44 of the Convention. It related to a bank which had gone into liquidation whilst being the right to discharge (RTD) holder on several registrations. The Applicant brought proceedings seeking to have the registrations discharged by the Registrar. The Court ordered the Registrar to effect the discharges and it duly did so.





There is a contractual target to maintain a system availability of 100%, subject to the provisions of the Service Level Agreement.¹⁷

Table 7 outlines the availability achieved based on the standard that if any function of the Registry is unavailable to users then the system as a whole is treated as being unavailable. The average availability for 2020 was 99.79% compared to 99.76% for 2019.

COMPLAINTS TO THE REGISTRAR AND THE SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY

Table 8 – Complaints made to the Registrar (2020)

Section 8 of the Regulations, read with Section 14 of the Procedures¹⁸, provide that any person may submit a complaint to the Registrar "concerning the operation of the International Registry" where a matter "relates to the general procedures and policies of the International Registry and does not involve specific adjudication by the Registrar or Supervisory Authority". If, within 30 calendar days of making the complaint, the person does not consider that the complaint has been or is being satisfactorily addressed by the Registrar, that person may submit the complaint to the Supervisory Authority.

Section 8.3 of the Regulations states that "[a]ny person adversely affected by a unilateral registration who reasonably believes that the registration does not meet the requirements of Section 5.4, 5.10 or 5.20 may submit a complaint to the Registrar".

During 2020, there were two complaints made to the Registrar under Section 8.3 of the Regulations

2020 Summary of Registration Activity 2006 – 2020





Parties to the Cape Town Convention & Protocol by Effective Date



Registrations by Object Type










User Setup *versus* Renewals




2020 Number of Priority Search Certificates Issued






Registrations Effected *versus* Priority Search Certificates Issued
